- content risks (fake news)
- contact risks (harmful interactions)
- conduct risks (online bullying)

RSE

(curriculum)

Pupils should be taught:

- internet safety and harms
- online relationships
- mental wellbeing

The Be Internet Legends pillars

Sharp

Curriculum pack: p.4-12

- Sharing carefully, safely and responsibly
- The concept of privacy
- Managing their 'digital footprint'
- How data might be used and interpreted

Alert

Curriculum pack: p.14-26

- Critically evaluating what they see online
- Noticing the signs that something might not be safe or accurate
- Knowing different kinds of online scams, such as phishing attacks

Secure

Curriculum pack: p.28-36

- Learning how to keep personal information private and secure
- Understanding how to build strong passwords, change privacy settings and use other safety tools

Kind

Curriculum pack: p.38-46

- Respecting each other as they would face to face
- Thinking about how to communicate online
- Conveying empathy and knowing how to respond to hurtful behaviour, like cyberbullying

Brave

Curriculum pack: p.48

- Coming forward and speaking to a trusted adult if they are worried about something they see online
