

P.E IMPACT REPORT - 2018-2019

Introduction

The PE and Sport Premium is government funding, designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. It was introduced in 2013 with the aim of encouraging more people to play sport safely from a young age, and help them keep playing sport throughout their life, no matter what their economic or social background. Schools receive PE and Sport Premium funding based on the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6; those with 17 or more pupils on roll receive £8,000 plus an additional payment of £5 per pupil.

The following actions have been identified to improve the P.E provision at Westroyd Primary School and Nursery and also to improve the amount of physical activity the children are participating in on a daily and weekly basis. The impact report shows what the funding was spent on and the impact it had on physical activity. It also highlights any amendments made to spending from the original action plan set in September 2018.

The total PE Sports Funding Received in 2018 – 19 budget = £16,900
