The Pupil Premium Budget is used to support the learning of children who are currently or previously been in receipt of Free School Meals. Interventions and support are also provided for all vulnerable pupils who are working below age related expectations, making less than expected progress in key areas of the curriculum or may have specific learning needs.

This supports the pupils being able to access teaching and learning in the classroom environment to the best of their ability and results in good progress. It has proved crucial to ensure that interventions are well-matched to the pupils' needs and that they are evaluated regularly.</p>
