

Westroyd Primary School and Nursery Pupil Premium Report 2017 - 18

This report explains how we have used the Pupil Premium in 2017-18. The Pupil Premium Budget is used to support the learning of children who are in receipt of Free School Meals. Interventions and support are also provided for all vulnerable pupils who are working below age related expectations, making less than expected progress in key areas of the curriculum or may have specific learning needs.
